Dear Friends,

This is truly an exciting time to be involved with the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. The last several months have been full of growth, challenges, and the development of some incredible opportunities to serve our friends in need. It is through the dedicated and selfless efforts of our team at SVdP, volunteers and staff alike, that these growth opportunities have been made possible. Included in your newsletter is a brief overview of the impact SVdP had during the last Fiscal year. As such, I'd like take a few minutes to share some updates with you about our current operations.

Partnership with Hunger-Free Polk County:

About two years ago the Polk County Board of Supervisors began raising awareness and dollars around the increasing need for food and food pantries in Polk County. As the dollars were raised, several key contractors were identified in the greater Des Moines area. Through the grace of God, as well as several presentations and proposals, St. Vincent de Paul has been chosen as one of these key partners.

To address this need, SVdP will be expanding food pantry hours starting May 1, 2016. The Pantry will now be open 8:30-3:30 Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, 8:30-7:30 Tuesday and Thursday, and 10:00-2:00 on Saturdays. We will also be installing refrigeration to provide produce and other healthy foods to our friends, as well as remodeling the pantry to increase accessibility and efficiency. Volunteers will be needed more than ever, so please consider joining us in the food pantry during our evening or weekend hours!

Healthy Relationships lowa:

One of the many challenges that our friends in poverty face are positive, healthy relationships. Relationships with significant others, children, employers, and families can all be challenges (as they can be for everyone). Individuals who are in the process of transitioning from prison to society face even more significant challenges around this issue. Fortunately, the Federal Government saw this need, and Iowa received grant dollars to begin addressing the issue of healthy relationships.

I am excited to share that SVdP is partnering with the Iowa Center (an affiliate of the University of Iowa), as well as St. Gregory Retreat Centers and the Bridges program to help individuals who are reentering society from prison. The focus of this work will be on healthy relationships at work and home. This is an exciting opportunity!

Maximizing Our Impact:

As you know, for the last two and a half years we have operated a second store on 63rd street. Unfortunately, we were not in an area with as high of need as we anticipated. As such, we closed the store on March 31, 2016. So please, do bring your donations to the 6th Avenue location now, and we'll continue to walk our friends out of poverty towards self-sufficiency.

As we move forward, there are going to be even more exciting opportunities ahead to positively impact the greater Des Moines area, and your support, donations, and volunteerism is sincerely appreciated.

Showing Our Success— Why our Work Matters

Nearly every day there is a friendly face working, learning, and researching in the Tom Varilek Education Center. His name is Roy, and he is a man on the mend.

Living in Chicago for a number of years, Roy struggled with addiction, specifically alcohol. For a number of years, he was a truck driver who could prevent his barriers from affecting his work. However, after 30 years of struggling with this addiction, he made the conscious decision to put God first in his life, which gave him the strength to free himself from his dependence on alcohol.

Roy was motivated to make changes in his life because he got tired of being frustrated with a life that was spinning in circles. He wanted a higher quality, more fulfilling life.

This motivation and dependence on the Lord provided him the strength to move away from the job and the life he was leading to start a new life in Des Moines.

So, where does Roy see his life going now? He wants to have a good career making a living wage. He aspires to improve his literacy in reading and math, as well as to perform well in the NCRC (National Career Readiness Certificate) assessment, receive a certificate of a Class A CDL (Commercial Driver's License) credential, and be able to live comfortably.

"St. Vincent de Paul means a lot to me," Roy shared. "They do a great job of helping people get back on track in their lives, especially if they have fallen short. St. Vincent de Paul understands the importance of patience, and they take the time to work with anyone to give them help and encouragement to take the next step in their lives. SVdP is an incredible resource for me, and I am grateful!"

The message of the Easter season is one of radical hope. Easter sings that the resurrection is not just an event after death, but a reality of everyday life. Unity, love, and wholeness are qualities of the resurrected life. Easter calls us to break through boundaries of nationality, race, age, mental capacity, and gender. We are to create a unity of life that allows the life of Jesus to be lived in everyone. We are to let go of old ways of feeling good about ourselves, and to reach out to a new integration of our many-faceted humanities. Like those who come to the empty tomb that first Easter, we may be frightened and confused. The promise of this season (Easter is 50 days, Lent only 40) is that God has the final word over darkness, be it sin, despair and death. The power of the Lord's resurrection is a rich grace that allows us to live our lives with vision that can transform us as we are living it! It is the empty tomb that says to us, "Go tell the others, and they will see me." (Mt 28:10)

I continue to marvel with gratitude the various ministries that are served by the metro conferences of the St. Vincent De Paul Society. Our apostolates show the face of the Risen Lord to those who experience the crucified life due to economic structures beyond their control, those who have no relational support, as well as those whose grief is so strong they are too weak to cry for themselves. Our efforts "raise up" the dignity of those we attempt to assist as God "raised" His Son, Jesus from death. St. Augustine tells us "Easter people are Alleluia people from head to toe." May "Alleluia" be our song of praise for all that God is doing through us to reveal the Easter message of hope in word and deed.
