MEET OUR NEW TOM VARILEK EDUCATION CENTER DIRECTOR

We are very pleased to announce the newest member of our Council operations team, joining us on January 1, 2015. Please join me in welcoming ANDREW GROSS.



My name is Andrew Gross and am honored to be the director of the Tom Varilek Education Center at SVdP. I think of my job as more of a vocation than a career. I spent my first 22 Catholic years in

education; nine years as a teacher, five as the Director of Religious Education at St. Theresa Parish, and eight years as principal of Holy Family School here in Des Moines. I spent the last 19 years in the public setting: as a superintendent, drug prevention coordinator, teacher, career advisor, and most recently as a literacy specialist at Des Moines Area Community College working with the underemployed and unemployed here in this area. So I was really excited to come "full circle" and consider this position.

My focus is threefold: First, to direct and grow the services offered at the center. Second, to explore all opportunities for the underemployed and unemployed in this area and build partnerships with agencies where possible – a network of charity. This will allow us to refer folks to their programs and have them refer folks to our programs. Third, to develop a process that will enable clients who receive emergency financial assistance from us to move toward self-sufficiency; be it furthering their education, gaining employment, or moving into a career. This follows our mission of "relieving need and addressing its causes."

REFLECTIONS – *From the Desk of* Fr. John Bertogli, Council Spiritual Director

The threefold mission of Lent, prayer, fasting and almsgiving, which engage us these 40 days, should lead us to a virtuous life all year long. They are used not only as a means to deepen personal growth, but for a greater awareness and service for



others, especially those in need. Christ's mandate allows us to see the face of Jesus in the marginal, frightened, desperate and discouraged of our communities. The St. Vincent de Paul Society and its local metro conferences are the arms, feet and heart of the Lord bringing life renewed hope to those who struggle to experience the basic needs of daily life. Such experiences lead us to the paschal mystery, entering into our dying and rising with the Lord. This is symbolized ritually in the events of Holy Week and Easter.

Palm Sunday ushers in the most sacred week of the Church year. Parish activities are not scheduled so that everyone can be part of these sacred days ("Triduum") that lead to Easter. Holy Thursday commemorates the Last Supper in which Jesus gives His Body and Blood in the Eucharist, which leads to service as the washing of the feet suggests. The stripping of the sanctuary reminds us that just as Jesus would be "emptied" on Good Friday, so are we!

Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence. This service is starkly simple to commemorate the Lord's death. Mass is never celebrated this day to remind Catholics that the Church's "highest form of public prayer" is absent to honor the sacrifice of Christ's death. Holy Saturday is a time of grief, but waiting with hope, as we keep vigil in darkness and exalt the Resurrection of the Lord. This liturgy is the most important of the year, for it welcomes new members into the community. God's divine love transforms everything, even sin and death in the resurrection we celebrate on Easter Sunday.

The message of Easter Sunday is one of radical hope. The power of the Lord's resurrection is a rich grace that allows us to live our lives with vision that can transform us as we are living it! It is the empty tomb that says to us, "Go tell the others, and they will see me." (Mt 28:10)
