### **Workforce Development**



Data compiled from previous cohorts, indicates participants' success in being hired and maintaining employment, at an increased wage, through the skills they received in the B2W program. The data shows a strong completion rate of the participants that enrolled into the class, as well as a majority of the participants maintaining employment for a period of time following the classroom portion of B2W.

Back2Work has been a program at St. Vincent de Paul Des Moines for a little over two years. It has had great success partnering participants of the program with businesses who mainly need employees for the trades industries. There have been 8 cohorts of the Back2Work program that have occurred over the course of two years.

Ready2Work, which is for young adults aged 16-21, has also had great success at St. Vincent de Paul. R2W has had 4 cohorts, which occur mainly in the summer when youth are not in school, in the last two years.





Moving forward, due to the Pandemic and the new normal, Back2Work has changed directions and is making it possible to hold a cohort virtually. Through the use of Google Classroom and Ed Puzzle platforms, and new filming equipment received by a generous grant, B2W has filmed the entire curriculum and has put the class together so it can be accessed virtually.

The goal with B2W being virtual is the availability to safely instruct participants and connect them to an internship or direct hire that will match their career pathways. The flexibility given by the virtual platform can allow more individuals to have the opportunity to learn the components of Back2Work.

# **Food Pantry Updates**



The reality of COVID-19 has led to many adjustments in our programming, including our food pantries. To ensure the safety of our staff and clients, we acted quickly to move to a contactless pickup system.

Clients call in to schedule appointment times, making pantry staff aware of any food preferences, allergies, or intolerances. Food is then placed in a designated area outside of the food pantry for clients to pick up at their scheduled time. Staff are also wearing face coverings, using gloves to handle food, and cleaning high touch points frequently. In addition, at times when COVID-19 numbers have spiked, we have sent volunteers home to ensure their safety until numbers come down.

Over the course of the pandemic, we have seen an increase in need. Many jobs were eliminated in the past year, leading to financial insecurity in the people we serve. In response, we lengthened our open hours to accommodate our clients. We also moved to a clothing voucher system, allowing individuals to get articles of clothing through the thrift stores rather than inside of our social services departments.





There are still clients who are being cautious and avoiding pantries because they or a loved one is in a high-risk group from COVID-19. Despite this, we continue to serve high volumes of individuals in need.

As staff are completing client intakes for the pantry, we are ensuring that other needs are met when identified. Our Back2Work and Immersion programs are available to food pantry clients in need of help overcoming barriers to reach selfsufficiency.



# **Making An Impact**

When we started our Immersion reentry program in 2018 we knew there was a need, but didn't realize how great it was.

COVID-19 had a great impact on those returning from incarceration. From the start of the pandemic we knew we had to continue to provide services, and let the community and those in need know we are still here and available to help.

Through community partnerships with the Department of Corrections, Bridges of lowa, and the Polk County Sheriff's office, we have been able to maintain connections to this vulnerable population. We have continued virtually teaching Healthy Relationships curriculum in correctional facilities and to the general public. We also offer 72-hour transitional programming pre-release.

During this quarter we were able to provide services to over 140 clients. These services include mentoring, educational opportunities, and career assistance. Our mentors maintain contact with a number of clients to offer continuing support. Immersion has thrived thanks to our eight mentors who have stayed with us during the past year.

St. Vincent de Paul offers a Healthy Relationships course to both clients and their loved ones at Bridges of Iowa. Bridges of Iowa is a local organization who strives to help those involved with the criminal justice system become reintegrated into society after drug-related charges.

During programming St. Vincent de Paul staff discusses six pillars including goal setting, avoiding blame, listening, changing behaviors, conflicts and disagreements and apologies and forgiveness with the participants.

Giving clients and their loved ones the same communication tools can be extremely beneficial in the building of a healthy relationship. Incarceration and involvement in the criminal justice system can put a strain on relationships and the quality of communication in a relationship. The Healthy Relationships course builds a stronger connection between clients and their family members, while offering participants a safe space to verbalize their feelings.


