

Our Immersion Reentry program is increasing the number of clients we are serving. We continue to offer the DOT written (knowledge) test to clients at 6th Ave. and Army Post Rd. This has been a great service as the Iowa DOT is usually backed up 4-6 weeks for appointments. It removes anxiety and allows participants to secure their license much sooner. We have been blessed with many donations specific to Immersion clients by the Iowa Law Enforcement Academy, Home Builders Association of Des Moines, and the New Hope Assembly of God Church in Urbandale. Our conference room was overflowing with these donations, and we have been able to help more clients than ever with their basic needs. If you are on the south side, please stop into our Immersion offices as we have received artwork from clients to show their appreciation for what we do. We have also benefitted from the Ft. Des Moines Residential Facility, and Kingdom Living clients coming to help enroll others in the program or assist with duties in the retail area and backroom.

THE PRESIDENT'S CORNER

Lewis Carroll, author of Alice's Adventures in Wonderland, once wrote, "If you don't know where you are going, any road will get you there." The point is, we all need to set goals in our lives and determine the milestones that will help us achieve them.

The leadership team at the Des Moines Council of St. Vincent de Paul has set specific goals for the coming years that align us with our strategic plan. Our executive committee and our Conference presidents have accepted these goals as our opportunity to promote our mission of "Helping Others Help Themselves".

Promote Active Conferences

The key to St. Vincent de Paul's success is our local parish based conferences. Strong conferences can support local people who seek assistance. They do this by offering individuals and families emotional support and financial assistance. But they don't stand alone. Many times, when a conference comes upon a financial need that exceeds their ability to help, they team up with other conferences in order to assist. The district council helps in these "twinning" efforts. Conferences are also the backbone for supplying volunteers in our stores, food pantries, and social programs. In that way they support the larger Des Moines community.

Organizations are often compared to a chain. Some links of the chain are stronger than others. Without strong Conferences St. Vincent de Paul would become just another agency providing needed services in our community. In order to strengthen the ties between the District Council and the Conferences I will continue my efforts to attend meetings of each of the conferences and their pastor to see what the District can do to help them and what the Conference can do to help the District. Additionally, we recently hired an individual to serve as a liaison between the District and the Conferences. Our goal is to help strengthen each of the conferences and explore the possibility of starting new conferences at parishes in the area.

Ensure the Sustainability of our Mission

We do great work at St. Vincent de Paul. That great work comes from many volunteers and dedicated staff. Not all, but much of what we do requires funding. By the Grace of God, we have been very fortunate in recent years to have obtained numerous grants that together with our store revenue have sustained us. We opened a new store in Windsor Heights in order to add to our business revenue. All of our stores have been setting sales records helping to support our mission.

Our sustainability should not, however, rely on grants that may not materialize in the coming years. We have adequate reserves for a rainy day, but we also have substantial debt. We need to retire a significant amount of that debt and develop new business activities that add to our bottom line. We also need more volunteers in order to alleviate the need for additional paid staff. We will be working on these issues in the months ahead.

Continue to Strengthen Our Brand

Last year, over 32,000 individuals were served with programming, continued education, food, clothing, and financial assistance. Our 1000 volunteers donated over 23,000 hours of time, over 125,000 customers were able to access affordable goods in our stores, and over \$1.5 million of charity was provided in the last fiscal year. Yet, St. Vincent de Paul remains relatively unknown not only in our community, but in our Catholic parishes as well. It is time to let the public and our parishes know of the good work that we are doing, not to pat ourselves on the back, but to strengthen our organization so that we can assist more people in need.

We have begun an effort to develop a marketing campaign to raise the level of awareness of St. Vincent de Paul. We will approach this campaign with the mindset of feeding the hungry, clothing the naked, providing shelter for the homeless, and visiting the imprisoned. With that as our guide, we can find success.

I began this article with a quote. Here is another credited to Yogi Berra, "If you don't know where you are going, you might wind up somewhere else." Together we can find a path forward to become a stronger advocate for the poor. I hope Yogi would approve. More importantly, I hope Jesus approves.

Although 2022 continued to be a challenge, we were able to provide over \$1.5 million of charitable services to more than 35,000 clients.



The goal of the Back2Work (B2W) Program is to help unemployed or underemployed individuals work their way toward self-sufficiency using a wholistic learning approach. Through classroom learning, internships, and individualized case management individuals will be ready to be successful in the workplace as well as the other components of their life. The ultimate hope of the B2W program is self-sufficiency for our clients, thereby fulfilling the primary mission of St. Vincent de Paul.

Back2Work has been a program at St. Vincent de Paul Des Moines for five years. It has had great success partnering clients of the program with businesses and helping them achieve employment at a living wage. There have been 18 classes of the Back2Work program that have occurred over the course of the five years. The Back2Work Program was created in Des Moines and has now been replicated at 10 other SVdP's nationwide. SVDP in Des Moines is currently working with two additional SVdP locations to help them place the B2W Program in their respective areas.

Following each classroom experience, participants will either complete an internship or proceed to direct employment depending on their individualized career plan. If participants complete a four-week internship, they are putting into practice what was taught during the classroom experience. If they choose direct employment, they continue to meet with the classroom facilitator and give progress updates. The pictures below show some of our recent Cohort participants presenting in during the classroom experience.

Data is collected for up to one year following the program. Data shows that in two of the groups since inperson B2W restarted, all the participants that completed class are now employed at a livable wage. Long-term data shows a strong completion rate of the participants that enrolled into the class, as well as a majority of participants maintaining employment for a significant period of time following the classroom portion of B2W.

During the year of 2022 a total of 6 Cohorts of B2W were held. The most recent Cohort had seven individuals successfully completed the classroom portion. Of the seven, 5 are employed with our employee partners, one is completing her internship and has a job offer and one is starting her internship! The program continues to have great outcomes and successful participants who are able to become self-sufficient.

Our Employer Council also met this summer and were able to get a look int o some of our successes that have completed the Back2Work Program. The pictures below show two of our successes' sharing with the Employer Council their journeys and how the SVdP Programs helped them become self-sufficient

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL FOOD PANTRIES

St. Vincent de Paul Des Moines has two food pantries that both sit in what is called a "food desert." The definition of a food dessert is an urban area in which it is difficult to buy affordable or good -quality fresh food.

Between both locations, clients have access to food 6 days a week. On average, each pantry serves 15 or more households a day. Clients can receive food, clothing, personal hygiene or household items that they are in need of at absolutely no cost to them.

The need for serving individuals in need of food only continues to grow. On average between our two pantries, we serve over 1000 individuals a month. As the need for assistance increases so does the cost of food. We are grateful for the Conferences that continue to support our pantries monetarily on a monthly basis. We are also grateful for the Conference members who donate eggs, and continually make the bread runs on a weekly basis, as well as volunteer in our pantries. We could not do it without all of you!

For both Thanksgiving and Christmas, we worked with Capitol City Produce who gave us free produce to help serve over 2000 individuals in our Hope for the Holiday baskets. We also served in our pantries, with the help of the Polk County Supervisors, 300 families with Fareway gift cards to help defray their grocery costs.

December was a busy month with the Hope for the Holidays Christmas baskets. We can't thank Ryan Doty and his DMPD team enough for all their help at both Thanksgiving and Christmas time dividing the produce for the Conferences. We can't thank them for their continued HELP!







VOLUNTEERS

St. Vincent de Paul has AMAZING Volunteers that support our mission daily. We couldn't do what we do without them. A volunteer onboarding is held once a month for anyone who is interested in learning more about volunteering. You can volunteer an hour a week or 40 whatever you want!
